






BLOOD STEM CELL DONOR AWARENESS PROGRAMME & REGISTRATION CAMPAIGN






BLOOD TRANSFUSION: REGULATIONS, SERIES-2




PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS- The road less travelled






WORLD SEXUAL HEALTH DAY

Toms, Assistant Professor, delivered vote of thanks. All the students were actively participated and clarified their doubts through QA session.






TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATION


Dr Shaiju David Alfi, MD & CEO gives teachers day message and encouraged all the teachers to be more enthusiastic and nurture model citizens for India.

The Department of Public Health Dentistry, Azeezia College of Dental Sciences and Research, Kollam and NSS Unit (NSS/SFU/KLM/KUHS/3) conducted an Oral Screening Camp on 30th August 2024 at Bishop Jerome Engineering College, Kollam. The camp commenced at 10am with an inauguration and the welcome address was given by the NSS programme officer Mr Laiju Thankachan. The NSS song was sung by the volunteers of NSS. The Oral Screening Camp started at 10 30 am. The students were divided into groups and demonstrated how to brush with a model and a proper brushing technique was also demonstrated during the camp.

A total of 147 students were examined out of which 60 students were advised a full mouth oral prophylaxis, 40 were advised restoration, 15 were advised orthodontic treatment and 15 were advised to undergo extraction. The camp concluded at 1:00pm with the vote of thanks by a NSS volunteer. The students were referred to Azeezia dental college for further treatment.

1. REPORT ON OUTREACH PROGRAMMES CONDUCTED THROUGH DISTRICT TB CENTRE ON 9/8/2024

As part of our NSS initiative, volunteers from Amala College of Nursing actively participated in various outreach programs organized by the District TB Centre in Thrissur. These programs are aligned with the objectives of the Nikshay Mitra initiative, a component of the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyan, which aims to support tuberculosis patients across India. Our involvement provided us with valuable insights into the operational aspects of TB care and the significant impact of community support in combating this disease.

Activities Conducted

- 1. **Nutritional Care:** Our volunteers assisted in providing food baskets to TB patients. These baskets included essential items such as cereals, pulses, millets, vegetable oil, groundnuts, milk, and micronutrients. This initiative aimed to enhance the nutritional status of patients, which is crucial for their recovery.
- 2. **Diagnostic Support:** The volunteers played a key role in advocating for the availability of free anti-TB drugs provided by the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program (RNTCP). Nursing. Our visit to the center offered a deeper understanding of the staffing patterns, activities, treatment modalities, and drugs available. Additionally, we gained insights into the National TB Elimination Programme, TB screening management, and various preventive measures.

These experiences have reinforced our commitment to community health nursing and the critical role that support systems play in the effective management of TB. The efforts of the volunteers not only contributed to the well-being of TB patients but also enhanced their own knowledge and skills in public health interventions.



Brief report

Visit to Karuna Bhavan, Plampazhinji on 07.09.2024

The NSS unit of our college along with IMA Karakonam branch organised a visit to Karuna Bhavan, a rehabilitation centre for mentally ill women, at Plampazhinji on 07.09.2024. The visit was organised to understand the challenges faced by women with mental illness, the treatment approaches adopted and the effectiveness of rehabilitation programs. It also aimed to bring the joy of Onam to the residents of the centre, promoting a sense of care.

The interaction with the staff revealed a dedicated team of 5 sisters including sister Darsana as the head, committed to improving the mental health and well being of the women. There were a total of 29 inmates. They expressed mixed emotions- some were hopeful about their recovery , while others expressed concerns about social stigma and reintegration into society

Medical check-up was conducted for the inmates by Dr. Sneha, Psychiatrist of our college. Essential medicines and needful things were also distributed to the residents.

A mini celebration including making pookalam and cultural events with songs and dance were also performed by the NSS volunteers along with the inmates.

The visit provided valuable insights into the operations of a rehabilitation centre for mentally ill women. While the centre offers essential services such as therapy, skill building and medical care, challenges such as stigma and family rejection remain significant barriers. The experience underscored the importance of mental health awareness, community support and resource mobilisation for the well being of these women.
