1. Results of the Elocution Competition:



- Mrs Rinu David, Associate Professor, Amala College of Nursing


6. Presentation:

The problems and needs were identified as isolated feelings; risk for fall and health education was given according to their needs. Recreational activities like music and newspaper reading were provided.

Report on NSS Special Camp "Jwala 2024"

The NSS Residential Camp "Jwala 2024," organized by the NSS Unit of SGNC, affiliated with KUHS, Kerala, commenced on December 27, 2024. This seven- day residential camp, held at Rangaprabhath,

concluded on January 2, 2025.

Under the guidance of Assistant Professor Ms. Akhila Nair M.P. (Programme Officer) and Ms. Asha E.K. (Assistant Programme Officer), the camp provided a unique opportunity for NSS volunteers to engage in various community-oriented activities, fostering social responsibility and holistic development.

Objectives of the Camp

The primary objectives of the camp were to:

Conduct medical camps to support the health and well-being of the local community.

Undertake garage cleaning and Anganwadi cleaning to promote cleanliness and hygiene.

Organize Snehasaprasam, a day dedicated to interacting with the inmates of a charity village, fostering empathy and social awareness.

Facilitate a mural painting class, encouraging artistic expression and creativity among participants.

Carry out college beautification by planting ornamental plants and creating a green belt.

Host a session on self-defense and fire safety, equipping students with essential life skills.

Purpose of the Camp

The camp aimed to cultivate essential skills among students, enabling them to evolve into socially responsible individuals. By engaging in diverse activities, the volunteers learned the values of teamwork, community service, and leadership, while also contributing meaningfully to society.

DAY 1 (27.12.2024)

The first day of the NSS Residential Camp "Jwala 2024" commenced on December 27, 2024, with great enthusiasm and anticipation. The event was

officially inaugurated at 2:30 PM by the Principal of SGNC, who flagged off the camp with the traditional NSS Geetham, marking the beginning of a week filled with community service and personal growth.

Ms. Akhila Nair M.P., the Programme Officer, welcomed the gathering and revealed the theme of the special camp, "Susthira Vikasanathinay NSS Uvatha," emphasizing the importance of sustainable development and the role of NSS volunteers in contributing to this cause.



To ensure the smooth functioning of the camp, the volunteers were then divided into six committees, each entrusted with specific responsibilities:

Food Committee – Responsible for organizing meals and maintaining food-related logistics.

Sanitation Committee – Ensuring cleanliness and hygiene throughout the camp.

Programme Committee – Planning and coordinating various activities and sessions.

Camp Paper Committee – Handling documentation and daily reporting.

Magazine Committee - Preparing the camp magazine, Manithar, to showcase

the activities and achievements.

Discipline Committee – Maintaining order and discipline throughout the camp.

This well-organized structure laid the foundation for a successful and impactful camp, with each committee working towards fulfilling the objectives of the camp. The volunteers began their journey with a sense of responsibility, unity, and a shared commitment to making a positive impact on the community.

DAY 2 (28.12.2024)

As part of the first-day activities of our NSS Special Camp, a session on self-defense was conducted to empower participants, particularly women and students, with essential techniques for personal safety. The session was led by Ms. Bijilekha, ASI and self-defense master trainer from the Trivandrum Vanitha Cell. It began with an introduction to the importance of self-defense and its role in boosting confidence and ensuring safety in everyday life. Participants were introduced to basic self-defense techniques to handle physical threats effectively. Hands-on demonstrations enabled students to practice and understand practical strategies for defending themselves in real-life scenarios. The session emphasized the importance of being aware of one's surroundings and maintaining composure during emergencies. A discussion on laws and legal provisions related



to women's safety helped participants understand their rights and the legal measures available to them. The session encouraged active participation and interaction, making it a lively and informative experience for the volunteers. The session concluded at 12:30 PM, leaving the participants well-informed and equipped with essential self-defense skills. The practical and engaging nature of the session made it a highly effective start to the NSS Special Camp activities.

As part of the second day of the special camp, an afternoon session was conducted by the Fire and Rescue Team of Venjaramoodu. The session commenced at 2:00 PM and was led by officers Mr. Manoj and Mr. Naji Mon. The program included both theoretical and practical components. The officers discussed various hazards caused by fire and emphasized preventive measures to avoid fire- related incidents. Participants were educated on different types of fire and the appropriate safety equipment to manage each scenario effectively. Detailed guidance was provided on rescue procedures during home-based incidents such as gas cylinder explosions. Realistic demonstrations highlighted critical rescue techniques and the use of firefighting equipment in different scenarios. The officers shared their real-life experiences, recounting challenges faced during rescue operations, which provided valuable insights to the participants. The session concluded with



a discussion on essential first aid and management techniques for individuals affected by fire incidents. The session concluded at 4:30 PM and was highly effective in enhancing participants' understanding of fire safety and rescue operations. The interactive nature of the session, coupled with practical demonstrations, made it both engaging and educational.

DAY 3 (29.12.2024)

On December 29, as part of our NSS special camp, we visited Charity Village in Nellanadu. The village is home to a geriatric population and mentally challenged children. We spent an entire day there, from 9 AM to 5 PM, engaging in various activities aimed at bringing joy and support to the residents.

The day began with a medical camp where we provided basic health checkups for the inmates. This included weight and height monitoring, blood pressure checks, and blood sugar testing.

In the morning, we also organized a series of cultural activities and fun games in collaboration with the inmates, fostering interaction and joy. The afternoon session was dedicated to recreating a Christmas celebration, complete with a visit from "Christmas Papa" and a cake-cutting ceremony.

We shared a meal with the residents, making the experience even more personal and meaningful. As a token of love, we gifted 20 packets of diapers to the Charity

Village, addressing one of their essential needs.

The day was a truly heart-warming and memorable experience, both for us and the residents, filled with moments of laughter, care, and connection.



DAY 4 (30.12.2024)

On the third day of our NSS special camp, we actively participated in a cleaning drive at the KSRTC Venjaramoodu depot garage. This initiative was conducted in coordination with the Nellanadu Grama Panchayat, with the support of the "Haritha Karma Sena," a team dedicated to waste management and environmental cleanliness.

The cleaning drive commenced at 9 AM in the presence of the Panchayat President, other Panchayat members, and the Station Master of the KSRTC depot. Together, we worked to clean the depot premises, creating a cleaner and more

organized environment. The drive concluded by 1 PM.

In the evening session, we shifted our focus to our camp surroundings. We engaged in campus cleaning and planting activities, contributing to a greener and cleaner environment. Parental Awareness on Drug Abuse: A special session was conducted for parents to raise awareness about the dangers of drug abuse among children. Six mothers attended the class, gaining valuable insights
