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Message from the Desk of Vice Chancellor

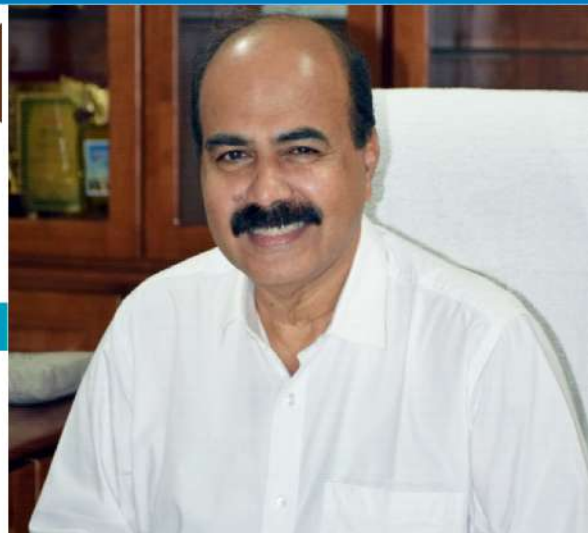

With immense happiness and pride, I am presenting before you the KUHS Newsletter Vol. 2 in a compiled form of four issues (issue 1-4), being put together in the Covid 19 pandemic situation.

Covid 19 Pandemic has disrupted the whole world. All of us are passing through a very difficult situation. The normal functioning of all educational institutions are suspended. But health professional educational institutions cannot be closed for a long time. Kerala University of Health Sciences have devised brave defence mechanisms to tide over the crisis.

The primary concern was the safety of our students. Their academics came next. The appropriate information on the safety measures to be taken for preventing the spread pandemic were provided through Webinars, and through the University website to the students and faculty. All theory classes were conducted virtually. Practical/ Clinical Classes were deferred. Pending University Examination results were expedited and large number of health professionals were made available.

Ekbal as chairman.

In short, with limited resources but with clear pragmatic ideals a university could tide over a most tumultuous period of crisis in its first decade of existence. It shows the commitment of the institution towards its founding principles and stakeholders.

I am happy to congratulate everyone who earnestly helped to create this volume of the KUHS Newsletter, even as we are striving hard to tide over the still continuing crisis. My best wishes to one and all.

Workshop on Simulation

Centre for Studies in Medical Simulation (CSMS), KUHS held two-day workshop in “Training of Trainers in Simulation Based Medical Education” on 2020 February 24th and 25th at KUHS Simulation and Skill Training Centre, Head Quarters of KUHS Thrissur. The workshop focused on the general aspects of clinical simulation training in medical education and skill development, of medical faculty, with high fidelity and medium fidelity simulations like task training manikins, full body manikins, Human patient simulators, computer screen-based simulation, Role play, etc.



The workshop was a sensitisation programme which help in the implementation of rolling out programme of competency-based curriculum. Workshops were conducted with the academic programme integrated with technical evaluation of the demonstration of simulation equipments for simulation lab. Organizing committee screened likely participants on the basis of three criterias.

1. Two faculty member from each College.
2. Priority for the faculty experienced as simulation lab in charges, medical education unit members and KUHS CCSS participants.
3. Proportional to the strength of each Health stream.

The final number of participants for the programme was 108 in total. The participants received academic credit points and certificates. No registration fee was charged from the participants.

Solar Panel Inauguration



KUHS has initiated a system to make electricity from solar energy for all needs of the University. The inauguration of the Solar Panel installation was done by Vice Chancellor Dr. Mohanan Kunnummal on 2nd March 2020. This was with the financial support from Government of Kerala and the contract was given to Keltron with a period of two months to complete the work. Kerala State Electricity Board will act as the Consultant. The solar plant will have a capacity to produce 250 KW electricity and the installation cost was 1 crore 61 lakh Rupees. After completing the work, the University can have about 2/3rd of the electricity needs met through this system.

PROGRAMMES OF SCHOOLS AND CENTRES

Advance Manuscriptology Workshop

A three-day Manuscriptology Workshop was conducted by KUHS School of Fundamental Research in Ayurveda at Government Ayurveda College Thripunithura on 7th, 8th & 9th January 2020. The participants were mainly those who have participated in the Manuscriptology workshop on October 2018, organized by School of Research in Ayurveda. The main objective of the workshop was hands on training in manuscriptology for Ayurveda faculty.



Workshop on Synopsis writing for PG Students

It is decided to conduct a workshop on Synopsis writing for PG students, in order to have uniformity in synopsis. Every year University is conducting training programme for PG students. But that was at a single centre common to all systems. Assessing the practical difficulty to assemble all students at a single venue it was decided to conduct workshops at five venues. This workshop is having two phases. Phase I syllabus finalization and giving training to trainers and Phase II conducting the training at five centres.



Phase I

The trainers were selected after considering their interest in teaching Research Methodology and their participation in certificate course in Research Methodology conducted by the University. Thus, 12 of the trainers were selected and they are requested to have a meeting at Thripunithura Ayurveda College on 10th January. After discussion the area to be taught are finalized and decided to have the workshop for two days at each center.

Workshops on Protocol writing for PG scholars



From 03-02-2020 to 12-02-2020

On the first day of the workshop 3 sessions were included: Session 1. Introduction to Research & Statistics, Session 2. Types of Studies & Designs and Session 3. Sampling & sample size. On the second day also there were 3 sessions: Session 4. Scientific writing, Session 5. Synopsis format and preparation and Session 6 – Exercises. The workshops were conducted at various places i.e. Thiruvananthapuram, Kannur, Thripunithura, etc.

BIOINFORMATICS

TWO DAY TRAINING PROGRAM 25TH & 26TH FEBRUARY 2020

*B*ioinformatics is an interdisciplinary field that develops methods and software tools for understanding biological data, which is an essential part in research. It includes the collection, storage, retrieval, manipulation and modeling of data for analysis. Bioinformatics combines biology, computer science and information technology to analyze and interpret biological data. The knowledge of basics of Bioinformatics is essential for a researcher. So, the aim of the programme is to create awareness and to provide an opportunity to the teachers of Ayurveda Colleges to gain knowledge in Bioinformatics. The quality of research can be enhanced and printed notes in Bioinformatics are made available to all faculty. About 40 faculty participated in the training programme.

Dean Students Affairs has conducted the Student Support and Guidance Programme (SSGP) District Review Meeting of Thrissur District on 06/ 03/ 2020 at KUHS Head Quarters. KUHS SUPPORT FOR FIGHT AGAINST COVID 19 PANDEMIC

FIGHT AGAINST COVID 19 PANDEMIC

The COVID 19 Pandemic which broke out in 2019 disrupted all domains of life in the planet. One of the worst affected was the educational sector. Kerala University of Health Sciences (KUHS) feels responsible as KUHS is the only health University in Kerala, to initiate steps in the tackling of COVID-19 outbreaks and similar outbreaks in future. Hence, KUHS has organised an emergency Strategy Planning Session on Corona Virus Epidemic with various eminent people in health sector, in and outside Kerala, as delegates to develop a protocol for tackling the issue. The theme of the session was "Let us face corona virus, without panic, but with caution". On 4th February 2020, the Strategy Planning session on Corona Virus Epidemic started at 10.30 am at VC's Conference Hall, 6th floor, KUHS headquarters, Thrissur. The session started with Dr Unnikrishnan, Dean Academic, inviting the delegates. Dr Manoj Kumar, Registrar, KUHS delivered the welcome address and in his address speech he mentioned that around 1,00,000 people who are either working or studying in the affiliated colleges of KUHS are ready to join hands. All the university activities like teaching, learning, examinations and academic administration came to a grinding halt since the affiliated institutions were shut down. Even on the face of this profound crisis, the Kerala University of Health Sciences put up a brave defense to tide over the disruptive situation.



As a first step, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, as an unusual initiative, addressed students directly and sequentially exposed them to the gravity of the situation, especially the basic steps needed for personal protection. He introduced the basics of the concept of online education in the evolving situation. Further, it was also advised to make themselves useful to their chosen professions by supporting the governmental agencies in spreading the message in the society. The need of the hour was to volunteer in the Break the Chain initiatives, community surveillance activities and conducting surveys, which were expected from each of them as a health science student. This message was conveyed to the University Students Union and they were taken into confidence to spread the message. The details were conveyed through the University website.

With the help of IT Section, all essential facilities were provided at the University. Local and willing staff were commandeered in sustaining the delivery of these essential services. Final year MBBS results were published during the period of COVID 19 lockdown. The necessary Certificates for starting Internship of Medical Students were sent online to the State Medical Council. As the Post Graduate admissions were going on during the period, Migration Certificates were sent online. Convocation was conducted online and 9438 Graduands participated in that. The degree certificates were also issued by post to all the graduates to their address. Online Graduate Register was prepared for all Graduands. Provisional certificates were issued to the 2400 students who were completed their House Surgeoncy. The first provisional certificates were issued to 2400 students through their colleges for starting their House Surgeoncy. The teachers were given advisory to prepare for the online classes, according to which they conducted online classes in different modes. Some of the theory classes were taken as videos and were uploaded in the YouTube, while some arranged classes through WhatsApp.

Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Groups, Microsoft Meeting, Cisco WebEx, etc. were also used as tools for the online classes. As per the directions from the VC of KUHS, the Deans of Faculty of Dental Sciences, Homoeopathic Sciences, conducted webinars etc.

Directions were given to the principals of colleges for facilitating the online classes which in effect meant that the academic activities of the colleges should continue at any cost. The courses of students who were active in COVID 19 defense programmes, ie, final year MBBS, PG Medical and Nursing students were not suspended because they were directly involved in the patient care. The principals were also directed by the university to provide other customized solutions to those students who could not attend the online classes. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor addressed online meetings with principals of colleges in a stream wise manner more than once, to explore the possibility of conduct of online exams, on how the courses can continue and when we can open the colleges.

A separate portal for public in the university website - "Pothujana Arogya Vijnanam (പൊതുജനാരോഗ്യ വിജ്ഞാനം)" was started. This was populated with materials and course materials frequently for public awareness and for the KUHS students who are conducting community activities on COVID 19. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor KUHS addressed the public through the television on several occasions.

The major highlights are being enumerated:

- Directions were given to all stake holders (students, teachers, institutions) regarding functioning.

- All pending final year MBBS results were published on a war footing, to facilitate availability of additional medical manpower for the Covid 19 defense initiatives of the state.
- Academic programmes were conducted to consolidate scientific knowledge base regarding COVID 19.
- Academic activities of the University were converted into online platform.
- A series of online surveys were conducted to assess the real time situation among all stakeholders and the health sciences educational sector.
- All meetings of academic bodies were conducted online.
- The Governing Council gave approval to confer the degrees online for the first time in the history of KUHS

SUPPORT TO KUHS STAFF

Provision of Hand Sanitizer: The pedal operated hand sanitizers were provided to the KUHS staff at all the entry points of each floor. ▶



▶ **Anti Covid Health Plus Mats** (foot wear disinfecting mats): The sanitisers are prepared according to the standards recommended by the National Coir Research & Management Institute (NCRMI) and the experts in the field. The mats

are dipped in a tray of this sanitiser. At all the entry points of the KUHS, this mats with the tray were placed on which all persons enter in to the University should press their feet to sanitize.

Provided mask: KUHS provided one pair of double layered Mask for each employees of KUHS

Face shield: The security staff who are direct contact with the staff and public coming to the University were provided with the face shields.

SUPPORT TO KUHS STAFF

Hand washing & Temperature monitoring: The Hand wash, water etc. were arranged at the entrance of the university building and the staff and other persons coming to the university were instructed to wash their hands before entering to the university building. The security staff were instructed to monitor the temperature of the staff and other people at the entrance itself who are entering in to the university.



Social Distancing: The staff were rearranged for ensuring the social distancing at work place. The registrar instructed the staff not to use the lift in order to keep the social distancing.

Use of Lift facility: The registrar instructed all the employees that the lift facility may use only for disabled persons, for going top floors, for persons with any other health problems and there should not more than 3 persons at a time in the lift.

MOODLE

A Global, Open Source Learning Management System

Moodle, the acronym for Modular Object-Oriented Dynamic Learning Environment, is a Learning Management System (LMS), an electronic learning platform, designed to provide educators, administrators and learners with a single robust, secure and integrated system to create personalized learning environments. It was originally developed by its founder Martin Dougiamas, who was raised in the desert, and learned by distance education through radio. His experience set the foundation for the idea for a more interactive and collaborative approach to distance learning, currently being managed from Australia. The first version was first released in 2002. Driven by open collaboration and great community support, the project continues to achieve rapid bug fixes and improvements, with major new releases every six months. The present version is coded Moodle 3.10.1+.

Moodle is used by institutions and organizations large and small, which include London School of Economics, State University of New York, Microsoft and the Open University. Moodle has more than 213 million users worldwide, which makes it the world's most widely used learning platform.

Moodle is Easy to use, and has a simple interface, drag-and-drop features, and well-documented resources along with ongoing usability improvements which make it easy to learn and use. Moodle is provided freely as Open Source software, under the GNU General Public License. The Moodle project's open source approach means that anyone can adapt, extend or modify Moodle for both commercial and non-commercial projects without any licensing fees and benefit from the cost-efficiencies, flexibility and other advantages of using it. Moodle is continually being reviewed and improved on to suit the current and evolving needs of its users. It has multilingual capabilities which ensure there are no linguistic limitations to learning online. Moodle is an all-in-one learning platform, which provides the most flexible tool-set to support both blended learning and 100% online courses. It can be configured to integrate most of the requirements needed for a course using its complete range of built-in features, including external collaborative tools such as forums, wikis, chats and blogs. Its modular set up and interoperable design allows developers to create plug-ins and integrate external applications to achieve specific functionalities. It is Scalable to virtually any size. Moodle is committed to safeguarding data security and user privacy, security controls are constantly being updated and implemented in Moodle development processes and software to protect against unauthorized access, data loss and misuse. Moodle can be easily deployed on a private secure cloud or server for complete control.

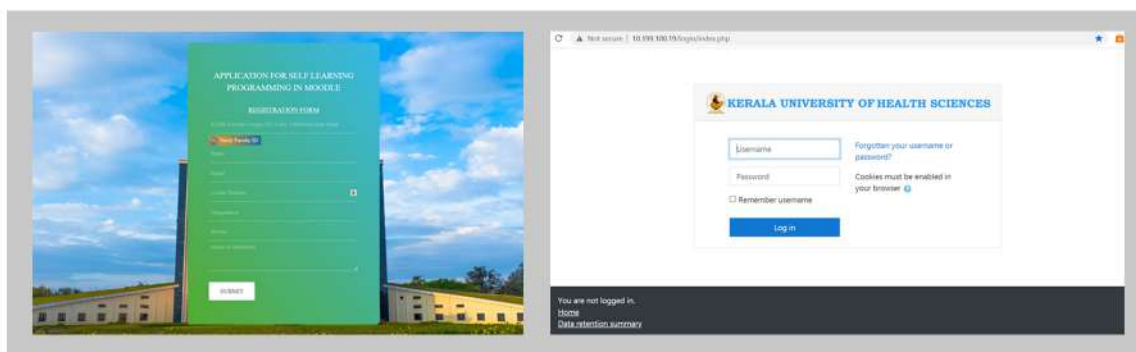

Moodle in KUHS

The disruption caused by the Covid-19 pandemic resulted in changing the instructional activities under the KUHS to online mode. This resulted in a spectrum of proactive measures from the KUHS. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor issued Advisory to the entire institutions to immediately start Online classes. The Dean Academic and Systems Manager (I.T), after extensive consultations and visits to different institutions, developed modules and learning materials for training teachers in the Training of Trainers (ToT) mode. A total of 7000 teachers, including Principals, Members of Boards of Studies, Academic Council and Senate were trained over a period of four months, using Moodle Platform. The first Certificate Program in MOOC mode was piloted successfully, and 245 Teachers were certified. The KUHS has now decided to convert all its Certificate Programs into MOOC mode, using MOODLE Platform.

MOOC CERTIFICATE PROGRAM IN HEALTH SCIENCE EDUCATION TECHNOLOGY-I (MOOC CHSET- I)

As part of the faculty development initiatives of KUHS, Academic staff college initiated a Certificate Program in Health Science Education Technology (C-HSET) in July 2019 and successfully trained 161 faculty members. The sudden outbreak of the COVID-19 resulted in the unexpected long term closure of Colleges and interrupting faculty development plans. In this juncture as a pilot project, Kerala University of Health Science planned to adopt Massive Open Online Course in order to bridge the learning gap. Applications was invited for Certificate Program in Health Science Education Technology on 8th October 2020. 260 participants registered for the Certificate Program. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Dr. Mohanan Kunnummal inaugurated the course on 20/10/2020 and shared his views regarding the significance of teachers training in health science stream. 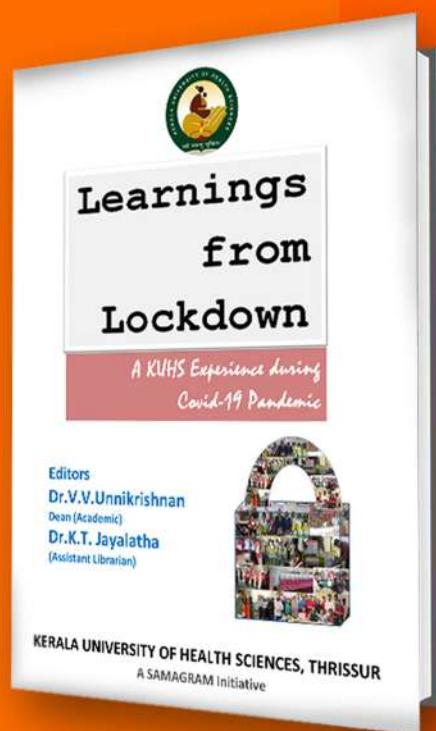
AWARDS & Honours

NSS *Activities of* COVID-19

Conducted by various NSS units under the University



The students of affiliated colleges under the University have supported the Government in fighting against the Covid-19. In spite of the physical lockdown, student volunteers of KUHS were engaged in various activities joining hands in the fight against COVID-19. A list of 4581 students of affiliated colleges were forwarded to Health and Revenue Authorities to be enrolled as volunteers in the Sannaddha Sena, who are willing to stand against this epidemic. Many of them are being utilized for voluntary work officially in some Districts. Details of all the NSS volunteers under KUHS were also forwarded to State NSS Cell, District Medical Officers, District Collectors, Principal Secretary to Govt. Health and Family Welfare Department, Govt. of Kerala, Trivandrum. Most NSS units attached to Govt. Medical Colleges were involved in activities like Sanitizer & Face Shield preparation, setting up of Hand Wash Kiosks and Break the Chain Campaigns. Many NSS units have created awareness videos on COVID prevention, Mental Health Issues and Health education, etc. Many fitness and dance challenges were raised through social media in order to keep up the health and wellbeing of students and public. A telephonic triage project called Pandemic Support by Students of KUHS (PASS-KUHS) was mooted by the students to assess and guide people suffering from lock-down stress.



This project is pending for implementation, as a pilot project, in Thrissur District for want of administrative permission from the District Authorities.

Many volunteers have attended the duties as per the direction of District authorities such as assisting in the screening activities at Check Posts, Data Entry work at Domestic and International Airports and also at District Medical Office. Supplying food and drinking water to police personnel and health workers and donated food materials to community kitchens.

Cleanliness drive at Railway Stations and Bus Stops were also attended Tracking route map and accompanying ambulance to bring the contact persons for examination and help the affected patients in quarantining.
