She is not able to tolerate even fluids orally. She also reports dysuria for 1 day. She is dehydrated, pale and febrile. She has tenderness in right iliac fossa and not allowing to touch. She is married, P1L1. Last child birth was 3 years back. Her last menstrual period was 45 days ago.
 - a) What are the differential diagnosis for the abdomen pain in this lady.
 - b) What are investigations needed to confirm the clinical diagnosis.
 - c) Outline the management plan for this patient. (7+7+6)
